Inscription... 1945
This chart incorporates that compiled by George Dumaresq in 1896, at the request of my great-grandfather, William Philip. It includes my own researches amongst the ancient parish records & Les Eglises de L'île de Jersey, with the assistance of C. J. Cooke Esq. in April, 1938, & I am greatly indebted to Edward John (1833), Edgar (1877), Alan (1882) & Eric (1884) for the additions they were able to make to my preliminary chart of November, 1938.

My friendship with members of four generations of our family, on both sides of the world, convinces me that name & blood are not the sole bonds uniting us & I pray that such a state may ever continue.

I should be honoured if members of the family would forward to me copies of records, dates & other information. This will be included in a family chronicle & entered on revisions & extensions of this chart.

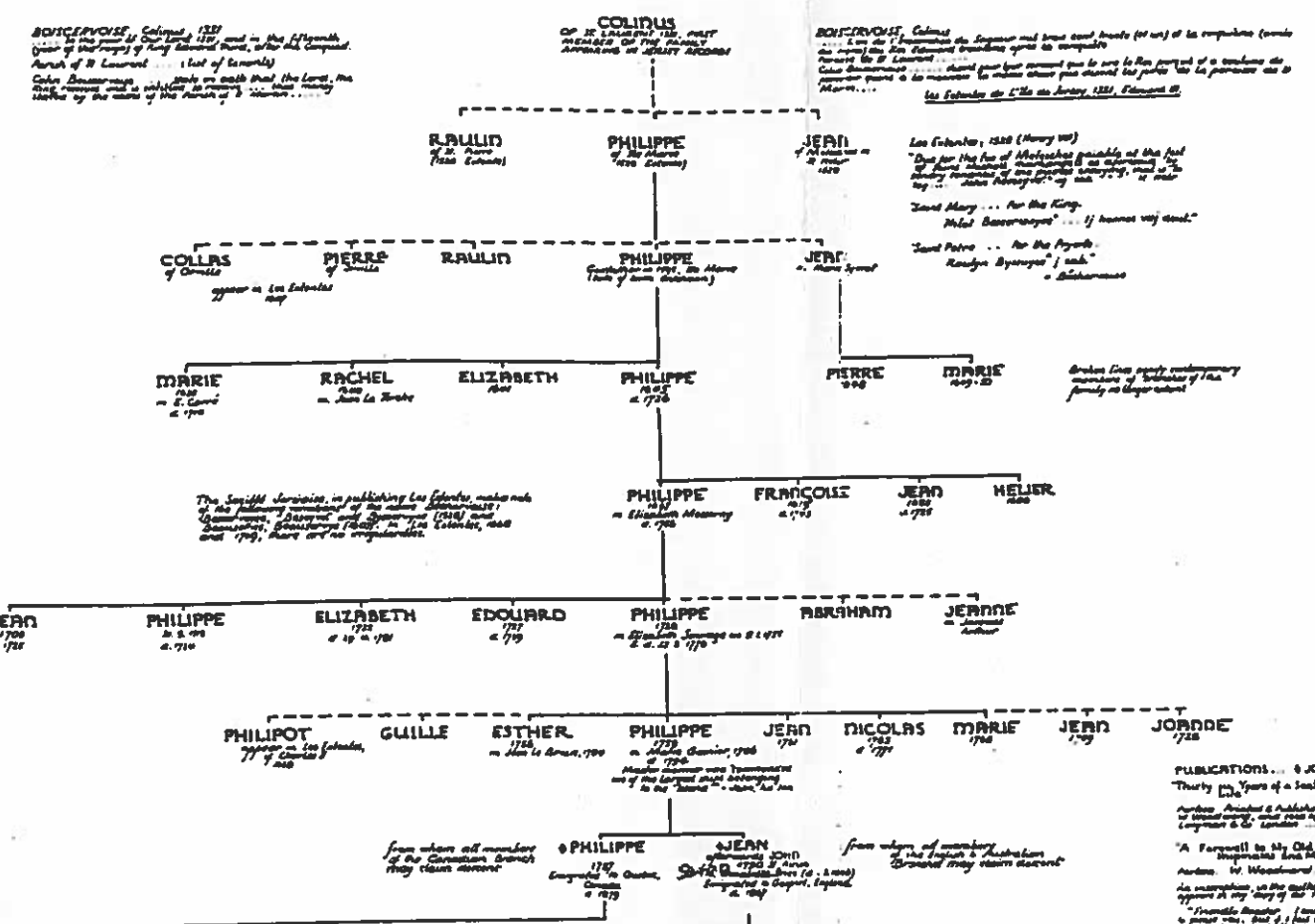
The 1945 Chart was dedicated to the Memory of John Béchervaise (1890-1960), Traveller, Trader & Author, Captain & Master of H.M. Private Ship of War, Lord Wellington's 6 of Charlotte, his wife - from whom all members of the English & Australian branches of the family may claim descent.

1960... I am grateful to relations who, for more than twenty years, have crisscrossed me to maintain this record. Some of my old friends are now dead, yet their sons & grandsons continue to send me news & goodwill.

Since 1949, I have enjoyed correspondence with some members of the Canadian branch of the family, and the chart accompanying this, chiefly as the result of the careful compilation of Douglas (1871) & of his daughter Alice Eden (1908), lists virtually all descendants through the male lines of Philippe (1787).

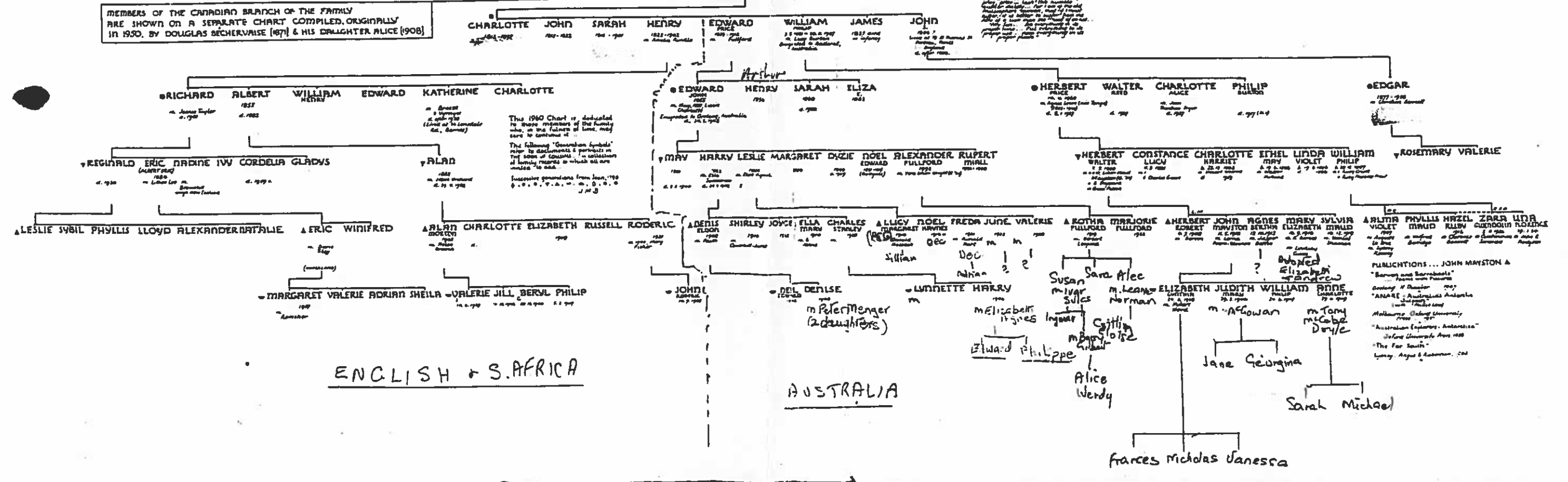


La Rue Béchervaise JERSEY ISLAND

Béchervaise Plateau TASMANIA
Béchervaise Plateau is immediately north of the summit massif of Federation Peak, in the Arthur Range, S.W. Tasmania. The first ascent of the mountain was made from this plateau, in 1949

Mount Béchervaise ANTARCTICA
"A great massif of brown rock rising sheer from the plateau ice on the northern face, with steep slopes on the other sides. It is bare, except for an ice cap on the flat summit area. 7,750 feet high, it is in about 70° 15' S., 64° 45' E. First visited in November, 1952..."
