our Lord one thousand eight hundred and
twenty eight at Quebec in the District of
Quebec aforesaid Before me John Peter
Tschouart Clerk with my orders acting
in this behalf as by law duly authorized

Personally came and appeared
Philip Samuel Richerwaire, Benjamin
Richerwaire, John James Richerwaire,
all of the Township of Quebec South, farmers.

Mary Charlotte Richerwaire, wife of
Frederick Marcet Dumaresq and the
said Frederick Marcet Dumaresq to assist
his said wife; Ellen Jane Richerwaire
widow by the first marriage of the
late William Patterson and by a second
marriage of the late Abraham Coffin on
the one part of the aforesaid Township
of Quebec South, Sophia James Richerwaire
and Isabella Richerwaire of the
said Township of Quebec South of the
first part,

And James Wilson Richerwaire and
William George Richerwaire also of
Quebec Bay South, farmers, of the second
part.

The parties of the first part for and in
consideration of the natural affection
they have for their brothers James Wilson
Richerwaire and William George Richerwaire,

The parties of the second part and
also to avoid all legal and other
proceedings and the cost of the same
do hereby and by these presents
renounce and relinquish for themselves
and their heirs and assigns for ever

Firstly, That the said James Wilson
Becherwaie and William George Becherwaie
shall afford a comfortable home
as in the parents letters to their
unnamed sister Sophia Louisa
Becherwaie and Isabelle Becherwaie
concerning their marriage and shall
then give them free of all cost each
one cow and two sheep.

Secondly That the said James Wilson
Becherwaie and William George
Becherwaie shall and do hereby
make themselves responsible for all
just debts of the estate of their
late father Philip Becherwaie and
their late mother Margaret Julia
Coffin
